Arts Teacher Fellowship

Any public or private school teacher whose primary responsibility is the teaching of visual or performing arts in a K-12 setting is encouraged to apply for a Arts Teacher Fellowship. This program is part of the Cultural Collaborations program funded by the Rasmuson Foundation and administered by the Alaska State Council on the Arts.

The Fellowship is designed to allow Arts teachers to reconnect with their primary art form and can be used for attendance at a workshop, seminar or other types of classes in their primary art form. It can also be used to prepare for solo shows in visual or performing arts. Past awards were given for a woodworking workshop, a series of opera performances and workshops, the preparation for a solo show at a local art gallery,
