E-Learning Modules

Acting as an Advocate for Students with Special Needs

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Learn what advocacy is as defined by law
- Delineate 5 types of advocates
- Understand the importance of advocacy to students, families, paraprofessionals, and teachers

Adapting Teaching Techniques to Meet Individual Needs

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Recognize the characteristics of effective teaching, understand the basics of Learning Theory and the Stages of Bloom's Taxonomy, and review the five stages of learning
- Recognize the value of data collection, understand the relationship between data collection-IEP-assessment
- Identify student strengths, individual student learning styles, and implement appropriate feedback & correction techniques
- Adapt instruction to accommodate individual students and develop strategies

Alaska Parent Guide: Education for Exceptional Children

The learner will have the opportunity to learn:

- Some of parents' rights with regard to the education of their exceptional child
- Some of the child's rights to an education
- The signs indicating the child's possible qualification for referral
- The process for evaluation
- Individualized education for a child
- How to initiate a complainant regarding education for a child

Child Abuse Prevention Training

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Understand the magnitude of child abuse and neglect in Alaska and the impact child abuse and neglect have on children
- Know which school district personnel are mandated reporters
- Comprehend Alaskan child abuse and neglect laws
- Learn techniques for recognition and detection of child abuse and neglect
- Know agencies and organizations in Alaska that offer aid to victims/families suffering abuse and neglect

Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Understand the magnitude of domestic violence and sexual assault in Alaska
- Better understand the lethality of domestic violence
- Understand the impact of childhood exposure to domestic violence & sexual assault
- Follow procedures designed to promote the safety of the victim and other household members

Eligibility Categories

In this module educators and parents will learn about each of the 13 special education eligibility categories. For each category learners will have the opportunity to:

- Understand the specific eligibility criteria
- Learn about accommodations and modifications for the classroom
- Identify different types of teaching techniques
- Gain knowledge of available community supports and assessment options.

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Fulfill the requirements of the Binkley Law mandating drug and alcohol related disabilities training for new educators
- Learn what fetal alcohol spectrum disorders are
- Learn the commonly associated physical and mental characteristics
- Understand how FASD affects learning and behavior
- Learn how to develop successful interventions and environmental accommodations

Introduction to Special Education

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Define roles and responsibilities
- Understand the procedural safeguards and protections provided by IDEA
- Consider the purpose of the IEP and how to apply the IEP for individual students
- Gain a general knowledge of the characteristics of children with disabilities

Precautions Against Blood-Borne Pathogens

The Blood-Borne Pathogen module has been created specifically to assist schools in complying with the federal law requiring annual training on blood-borne pathogens. This training will help school district staff better understand what blood-borne pathogens are, how harmful they can be, and prevent exposure to them.

Supporting Positive Student Behavior

The learner will have the opportunity to:

- Help students develop positive self-esteem
- Become familiar with the steps surrounding an IEP
- Learn how to use the IEP information
- Appreciate the positive outcomes of a school wide positive behavior support program
