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DEED and DHSS Launch Professional Development Webinars to Prepare for the 2020-2021 School Year

JUNEAU – The Department of Education and Early Development (DEED), in partnership with the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) and the Region 16 Comprehensive Center, is launching a series of webinars to support parents, teachers, school district staff, and education leaders and stakeholders in planning for the uncertainty around the restart of school during the COVID-19 pandemic, aligned with the revised Alaska Smart Start 2020: Restart & Reentry Framework Guidance for K-12 Schools.
