Biden passed Executive Order (EO) 14019 directing federal agencies to consider ways to expand citizens' opportunities to register to vote and to obtain information about, and participate in, the electoral process. Through the child nutrition programs, operators have the ability to reach Americans to provide them with information about voting."
