What is a WebQuest?

A WebQuest is a prescribed learning experience that allows students to explore a topic, based on an "inquiry". The inquiry leads one to conduct research on the chosen topics on web sites that have been pre-selected by the curriculum designers. This can save time and often provide more accurate information.
